BUDGET INFLUENCES/SIGNIFICANT VARIANCES:

- Application revenue is expected to remain similar to 2023. 5-year Financial Plan shows a slight increase in application revenue starting in 2025. Anticipated that a review of application fees will be conducted in 2025.
- Regional Land Use Planning had two vacancies in 2023 resulting in less expenditure under salaries and mandatory benefits than budgeted. Salaries increased between 2023 and 2024 due to approved Collective Agreement (2022 to 2024) in 2023. No new positions are planned in 2024.
- The 2023 budget shows transfer of funds (\$132,000) back to the Inspection Services (2901). The original funds were provided in 2022 for commissioning a property and application tracking software for Development Services (HUB Online).
- Advertising expenditure has been reduced in 2024 as a result of Public Notice Bylaw No. 3316, 2022 and Public Notice Additional Methods of Publication Policy RD-24-23.
- Community Works Funds will be utilized for the replacement of Electoral Area A Official Community Plan project.
- The 2024 revenue listed on budget line number 15500 for \$524,938 is grant funding carried forward from 2023 for the Regional Disaster Risk Assessment project.
- The revenue listed on budget line number 15801 for \$262,470 represents a temporary transfer from Inspection Services (2901) to assist with the expenses of the Regional Disaster Risk Assessment project until full grant funding is received in 2025. In 2025, the grant funds will be transferred back to Inspection Services.
- Consultant expenditures are related to Regional Disaster Risk Assessment project (\$787,408) and replacement of Electoral Area A Official Community Plan project (\$150,000).
- Planning for vehicle replacement in 2024.
