

Re: temporary permit for campground

On March 3rd, 2021 I filled out and applied for a permit for a campground on my property to help relieve the shortage of accommodation in Valemount due to pipeline construction. I didn't receive approval until November 18th 2021. After developing the land and buying equipment to run the campground, I lost a year of revenue due to receiving the permit so late. The follow two years have been slow and this year was affected by the extended highway closure due to fires in Jasper. I need to recover more money to pay for my start up costs and would like to renew my permit for the set up campground to attract tourism traffic. Regarding the sewer trailer in the site sketch, the trailer is custom made and fully insulated. There is a separate potable water compartment with a 4000 litre tank in the front that pumps water to the rv's. In the back compartment there are five 2000 litre tanks for sewer storage. Each rv stall has an aluminum box with a grinder pump to empty the sewer from the rv. The boxes then pump into the trailer. When the trailer is full a truck comes and empties the trailer and another truck fills the fresh water as needed. I received approval from the environmental

health officer when the campground was set up in 2021.

 What is this used for?

Thus, allowing the public and the Regional District Board to understand your proposal and goals.
