ISSUE(S):

Public Safety and Community Services Administration would like to engage in "as and when" engineering services for services valued at \$25,000 or less per project. The term of the contract is anticipated to be two years with a potential for extensions not to exceed a total contract duration of four years.

The Board is being asked to consider authorizing a competitive bid process for engineering services to support the coordination and implementation of various Public Safety and Community Services projects.

SERVICE RELEVANCE:

Public Safety includes:

- the 9-1-1 Emergency Response Service which supports the administration and operation of the primary 9-1-1 call answer function and the centralized fire/rescue dispatch communication system and the Fire Department Coordination Services;
- the Fire Department Coordination Service supports the fire/rescue agencies to help ensure high service levels; that the standards are implemented, followed, and maintained; that required training and certification is readily available and affordable; coordinates the purchasing of fire service equipment and apparatus; provides for fire and life safety and fire prevention education programs; and ensures emergency responses are coordinated safely, efficiently, and effectively.

Community Services is integral in the establishment of new taxable services as well as providing administrative support for many services at the community level such as street lighting, community halls, utility projects, TV rebroadcast. Community Services coordinates projects and works with non-profit community groups for the improvement and sustainability of these community assets.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATION(S):

The contract for “as and when” engineering services would be for consulting services valued at \$25,000 or less per project. Where services are reasonably expected to exceed a cost of \$25,000 per project, going to competitive bid would be required in compliance with the Regional District purchasing policy.

The cost of engineering service expenses would come from the benefitting local service budgets.

OTHER CONSIDERATION(S):

Community Services Administration, which included Public Safety Services at the time, entered into an “as and when” contract with a local engineering consultant for in 2019 and again (by way of the competitive bid process) in 2021. These contracts have been highly beneficial and have enabled many projects to receive the focus and necessary engineering expertise to bring projects to completion or to provide appropriate direction. It has been a struggle in the past to engage engineering services in a timely manner, especially for those projects with smaller budgets and more remote locations.

DECISION OPTIONS:

1. Approve recommendations.
 - Public Safety and Community Services Administration will proceed with the competitive bid process for “as and when” engineering services and will return to Board with a recommendation for award at a future date.

Other Options:

- a. Do not approve recommendations:
 - Public Safety and Community Services Administration may not be able to complete projects in a timely manner; and
 - Potential for delays if engineering services are needed and proponents are not available.

COMMENTS:

Public Safety and Community Services Administration have been engaged in a beneficial “as and when” contract for engineering services for two contract terms. The contracts have been very successful and are worthy of further consideration for continuation by the organization.

Public Safety and Community Services Administration recommend proceeding with the competitive bid process to engage “as and when” engineering services.
