ISSUE(S):


The *Community Charter* requires that the Regional District hold all meetings in public except in certain defined circumstances to protect the public interest or, in some cases, the interests of third parties. Before considering a matter in closed session the Board must pass a resolution stating the basis on which closing the meeting to the public is authorized by the *Community Charter*. The Regional Board is being asked to close the meeting to the public to permit consideration of agenda items pursuant to Sections 90(1) (c) and (e) of the *Community Charter*.
